

PUBLIC NOTICE WITHDRAWAL OF DISTINCT PROJECT BYLAW 596-17

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given:

- 1. On July 3, 2023, Council adopted the Distinct Project Bylaw 596-17 (Concerning the Noise Corridor Along Route 104);
- 2. According to the *Act Respecting Land Use Planning and Development*, as well as articles 532 and following of the *Act Respecting Elections and Referendums in Municipalities*, the Town held a Register of Interested Persons to Participate in a Referendum on July 21, 2023;
- 3. According to article 553 of the *Act Respecting Elections and Referendums in Municipalities* article 21.1 of the *Act Respecting Tourist Accommodation Establishments*, the number of signatures required in the Register to trigger the holding of a referendum for Distinct Project Bylaw 596-17 was 51;
- 4. Seventy-nine (79) people signed the Register;
- **5.** According to article 558 of the *Act Respecting Elections and Referendums in Municipalities*, September 5, 2023, was the last day to set the date of the holding of the referendum;
- According to article 559 of the Act Respecting Elections and Referendums in Municipalities, the Town could decide to withdraw Distinct Project Bylaw 596-17 instead of proceeding with a referendum;
- 7. At the August 7, 2023, Council meeting, Council withdrew Distinct Project Bylaw 596-17, thereby ending the adoption process for this draft bylaw (Resolution 2023-08-269).
