BY-LAW 576-1

MODIFYING BY-LAW 576 CONCERNING THE DIVISION OF THE TERRITORY OF THE MUNICIPALITY IN SIX (6) ELECTORAL DISTRICTS

TO ALL VOTERS OF TOWN OF BROME LAKE

NOTICE is hereby given by par Christine Marchand, Assistant Clerk of Town of Brome Lake, that at the meeting of April 2, 2024, the municipal council adopted by resolution a draft project of the by-law titled ***By-law 576-1 Modifying By-law 576 Concerning the Division of the Territory of the Municipality in Six (6) Electoral Districts***.

This project modifies By-law 576 that divided the territory of Town of Brome Lake into six (6) electoral districts and delimits these districts in order to ensure an equilibrium as to the number of voters in each electoral district and their social-economic homogeneity.

NOTICE is given that the draft project of By-law 576-1 is available for consultation at the Town Hall during regular business hours at the address indicated below, as well as on the website of the Town: lacbrome.ca/en/residents/municipal-by-laws/

NOTICE is also given that any voter may, in conformity to Section 17 of the *Act Respecting Elections and Referendums in Municipalities (L.R.Q., c. E-2.2)*, within fifteen (15) days of the last publication of this Notice (April 4, 2024), make known in writing their opposition to this draft project of By-law 576-1.
