

As summer comes to an end, I'd like to say a few words on some subjects of interest in the municipal life of the Town of Brome Lake. As you have already read in previous issues of VLB info TBL, 2023 will be highlighted by the creation of a new Strategic Plan. A first information session, held in mid-July, allowed us to inform people of the results of our survey and a work session. We will comment on these later in this issue.

Other steps in the consultation process are scheduled before the preparation of the final document. Follow our various platforms to know when you will be able to express your point of view. The Strategic Plan is the fundamental tool by which municipal operations will be governed during the next five years.

It is also with great pleasure that we recently welcomed into the municipal administration our new environmental advisor. Anaïs Renaud has many years of experience as a biologist and knows our lake like the back of her hand, having worked with Conservation Lac Brome. She remains one of the people best suited to manage the environmental initiatives already undertaken; for example, our action plan for a healthy lake, and she will also propose new ones!

Please join me in in welcoming Ms. Renaud, about whom you will learn more in the following pages.

In closing, we are celebrating this year, on October 28th to be precise, the 20th anniversary of the establishment of our First Responder service. For the past two decades, these devoted women and men - today there are 31 on the team - have been the guardian angels of our community.

They have shown courage, compassion, and professionalism in emergency situations, saving lives and bringing essential support to people who found themselves in vulnerable situations. On behalf of the residents of Brome Lake, I wish to express my deepest gratitude to all those people who have worn the uniform of the First Responders.

STRATEGIC PLANNING: THE THOUGHT PROCESS IS WELL UNDERWAY!

The steps leading to the creation of a new Strategic Plan are proceeding, in collaboration with Raymond Chabot Grant Thornton, the firm we have hired to assist us.

In addition to our survey which yielded 1100 responses, we made a number of findings during the numerous consultations held in the second trimester of the year.

Below are some of the conclusions from the survey:

- The majority of residents came to Brome Lake because of the quality of life and to take advantage of their retirement
- More than 80% of the citizens state that they feel a deep attachment to their town or their sector
- The priorities in terms of environment and the development of the area are the preservation and protection of the environment including the lake as well as the development and accessibility of green spaces

A workshop held at the beginning of June highlighted certain significant points:

- Develop outdoor activities, including during the winter, to revitalize the low season
- Attract young families to rebalance the demographic structure
- Develop affordable housing to respond to the needs of the population in general and to attract young families
- Improving citizen consultation on the Town's decision-making processes





Our Residents' Guide is a new 56-page communication tool intended to help you research information about the Town of Brome Lake and the services offered.

Among other things, it contains a detailed overview of each department (Communications, Finance, Town Clerk, Recreation, Town Planning, etc.), a map of the infrastructure and parks, a snapshot of our town including statistics, and much more. All this is presented with marvelous pictures of Brome Lake taken by our own people!

Last year, a new parking area was built on Bondville St. facing the lake. This year, landscape architects have developed a vegetated shoreline in order to filter contaminants that could run into the lake. This wide shoreline band contains a number of indigenous plants, mulch and superb benches made of large stones. Other work will be carried out this summer, notably a pedestrian crossing and the installation of informational signs.

Important clarification: there was never any question of creating a second beach at this location. The topography simply doesn't allow it. The Town of Brome Lake is legally obliged to respect provincial regulations requiring a 10 to 15-metre wide vegetated riparian buffer strip along watercourses to protect them from contaminant runoff and it has precisely accomplished that.

As a governmental authority, the Town has a duty to set an example for waterfront property owners in terms of the measures to be taken to ensure the quality of its most precious asset, the lake.

SCHEDULE FOR FUTURE WORK

- Autumn 2023 preparation of the second level of parking
 - Spring 2024 construction of the sanitary unit
- Fall 2024 the landscaping of the paths and sidewalks
 - Fall 2024 final work on the parking area

Our recreation department staff is developing ideas on what might be placed in the vast wooded area of the land, which offers an interesting recreational potential. Walking paths and sliding areas in the winter are some of the ideas that have been put forward to date.

A FEW REMINDERS ABOUT THE CARKE TERRACE

- You can now park, picnic, enjoy the site and access the water.
- Motorized watercraft are forbidden and the cleaning of your canoe, kayak, paddle board or other craft is mandatory, prior to accessing the lake. Our boat cleaning station is located at 685 Bondville Rd.
- Camping and littering on the site are forbidden.

A New Collective Agreement for Our Blue Collar Workers!



The Town of Brome Lake has recently made significant progress in its relations with its blue-collar employees by signing a new Collective Agreement. This five-year agreement is the result of in-depth negotiations between the representatives of the municipality and the municipal workers. It reflects the commitment of both parties to work together to ensure fair working conditions, harmonious operation of the municipality and that the service offered to citizens meets their expectations.

The signing of this Collective Agreement demonstrates the willingness of the Town of Brome Lake to recognize and value the important role played by the blue-collar workers in the maintenance of the parks' infrastructure, the cleanliness of public spaces, and the general welfare of the community.

The Mayor of Brome Lake, Richard Burcombe, is pleased with this result. "I am proud that the parties have arrived at a consensus. It's an agreement that respects our ability to pay while improving our capacity to attract a quality workforce. Our priority is to continue offering quality services for our citizens."

The Town of Brome Lake wishes to point out the significant contribution of the Union of Municipal Employees of Brome Lake which is affiliated with la Centrale des syndicats démocratiques (CSD). It wishes also to express its deep gratitude to the blue-collar workers for their involvement and their dedication in supplying exceptional service to the community.

In summary:

- The Collective Agreement covers the period from February 6, 2023, to February 5, 2028.
- It provides for a revision of the existing salary structure: an increase of 5% this year, 3% in 2024 and 2025, and then 2.5% for 2026 and 2027.
- An indexation to the Consumer Price Index (CPI) of a maximum of 3.5% is provided for in the years 2024 to 2027.

20 YEARS FOR OUR FIRST RESPONDER SERVICE!

arch 2003, the first team of First Responders in the Town of Brome Lake was officially established. Initially made up of 16 volunteers, our team now consists of 31 devoted people who work hard to make our community safe.

For Alan Bowbrick, who has been part of the team since its beginnings and who is now its leader, getting involved with First Responders makes a difference in the community. "It is an honour for me to make a positive change in the life of my fellow citizens and to help them during difficult times," explains Mr. Bowbrick.

To highlight their 20th anniversary, the First Responders are organizing an evening celebration in October. During that event, a Governor General's medal will be presented to the First Responders who have been on duty for the past 20. They are Alan Bowbrick, Réginald Gauthier, Philippe Hébert and Glenn Mason. Congratulations to all of you for two decades of loyal service!

How does it work?

When you dial 911, operators decide whether or not to contact our First Responders, depending on the nature of the call. In Lac-Brome, a minimum of two First Responders are available at all times to answer emergency calls, to ensure maximum assistance to our fellow citizens in distress.



Some information about our First Responder SERVICE

- Our service receives an average of 1.3 calls per day; that is 475 calls per year.
- In 2022, the service took 560 calls, the highest number ever recorded.
- In addition to the Town of Brome Lake, our First Responders also serve the territory of Bolton West.
- 80% of calls received by our First Responders come from the Knowlton area.

OUR ENVIRONMENT



MEET ANAÏS RENAUD, OUR NEW ENVIRONMENTAL ADVISOR!

ast July, we introduced Anaïs Renaud, our new environmental advisor. Learn more about her in this question-and-answer session that we devised!

1. WHERE ARE YOU FROM?

I am from the Outaouais Region, but I have moved often in my life. I've lived in Manitoba, Ontario and Quebec and have been in the Sherbrooke-Magog area for some 20 years.

2. WHAT BROUGHT YOU TO THIS REGION?

The beauty of the countryside and the proximity of nature brought me to reside here. I like the community spirit and the people of the region. I am a country girl who enjoys life surrounded by nature, seeing that I love animals and hope someday to own a small farm!

3. What brought you to become the environment advisor for the Town of Brome Lake?

As a biologist, I worked for six years with the *Organisme de bassin versant de la Yamaska* where I coordinated with *Conservation Lac Brome*, previously known as *Renaissance Lac Brome*. I believe deeply in the health of the lake and I want to be involved directly in decisions related to the lake. I also wanted to touch various environmental aspects of the region in order to broaden my experience.

4. WHAT MOTIVATES YOU IN YOUR DAILY WORK?

I am motivated by the launching of new projects that make a difference. After an environmental evaluation, an inventory, a study, I like to create an action plan targeting specific problems and then measure the results of these actions.

I am particularly interested in the conservation of wetlands but all environmental subjects are important to me. I like to think of various ways to protect an environment that will be accessible to all.

5. What are the environmental issues that are a priority for the Town?

As environmental advisor, I will propose improvements for:

- a) the health of the lake and its watershed;
- b) a better management of residual materials;
- c) more sustainable mobility;
- d) the conservation of natural areas, including the control of invasive and harmful exotic species.

For example, I will work to put into place regulations for the cleaning of watercraft. I am also working on a project that will decrease runoff rainwater towards the lake.

Obviously, the raising of awareness will be at the heart of my mandate because we need the cooperation of all citizens to improve our environment.

6. How do your colleagues describe you?

I ask a lot of questions and that is often the first characteristic that my colleagues think of. They also describe me as a person deeply involved in her work. Having been a nurse in my first career, I enjoy helping others and I am always available to listen to my colleagues. I also enjoy having fun and participating in various activities whenever possible.

New Guidelines on Invasive Plants

Certain plants are considered noxious to the biodiversity of the ecosystem and even to public health. It is therefore very important to identify these and know how to eliminate them.

To this end, the Town of Brome Lake has produced an informational guide dealing with the four main species of invasive plants on our territory: giant hogweed, ragweed, Japanese knotweed and the common water reed. The guide includes descriptions to enable you to identify these plants as well as methods to reduce their spread.

Something New in Our Parks!





The Town is very pleased to announce that, in the coming weeks, the construction and equipping of a new Pumptrack will begin at the Centre Lac-Brome. The unique design of this new infrastructure, which will be situated next to the skate park, was planned by the Flow Park Company and was designed for use by practitioners of skateboarding, cycling, scooters and more!

This facility will include a pavilion and a lighting system which will undoubtedly please future users who will be able to take advantage of the track at the end of Autumn, according to the planned timetable. An official inauguration will take place in the Spring of 2024.

In addition, some of you may have noticed the new shade panels that have appeared in Lions Park. The installation of these first shade panels between the pickleball field and the exercise equipment will allow users of the park to protect themselves from the sun and heat when they practice their favourite activity.

Other shade panels will be installed between now and the end of summer, notably near the water park at the Centre Lac-Brome and at the soccer field in Lions Park. This new equipment, financed in large part by grants, will add some color to the existing landscaping!


