

#### Dear fellow citizens.

We have recently unveiled our financial results for the year 2022. As you will see in the details below, we have accumulated a surplus of \$2.96M. Council has decided to allocate 2 million dollars of this surplus to two separate initiatives. The first is to go towards working capital. This allows us to make purchases without borrowing money from financial institutions (\$1M). The second amount will be allocated for road and street repair projects (\$1M).

Regarding our roads and streets, we have made some progress over the past few years in rehabilitating the network. A number of significant projects, however, are yet to come; for example, the reconstruction of Fulford Road. Our financial reserve for road construction projects has reached \$2.79M. Having a surplus is an advantage because the amount to be borrowed is decreased. This is significant in this period where interest rates are very high.

On another subject, it is with great pleasure that I inform you that we are working on a housing strategy. This will undoubtedly contribute to the next revision of our Town Development Plan.

Our town is facing several challenges in the area of housing, whether it's the increase in the price of houses, a phenomenon that has taken on more significance with the pandemic, or the availability of affordable rentals. The question of availability is a cause of concern, and we will touch upon it below.

This diagnostic will present an accurate picture of the situation which will allow us to evaluate our options and propose concrete solutions. Because this is a process, I invite you to stay tuned to our communications on the subject over the next months.

In closing, I would like to touch upon a project that had a major impact on the landscape of our town center: the reconstruction of the Mill Pond dam. Now that the work has been completed, it is amazing to see the extraordinary panorama offered by a return to normalcy of the level of the Mill Pond. I am certain that this brings back happy memories for many of you.



# THE TOWN OF BROME LAKE CURRENTLY REVIEWING HOUSING NEEDS

A new strategy on housing is being developed. With the help of Jean-François Vachon, it will become part of a new Town Development Plan which will be presented in 2024.

#### WHY DO WE NEED A HOUSING STRATEGY?

The housing situation has evolved over the past years in the Town of Brome Lake and the real estate market has been affected by an increase in the price of homes. This reality has become more serious in the region of Brome-Missisquoi since the pandemic and the price of houses in Lac Brome has increased by 58% since 2019.

This increase in the price of homes, as well as the increase in the interest rates, constitutes a barrier to access to ownership for first time buyers. In addition, the residential inventory in Lac Brome is made up mainly of single family dwellings (81%), which results in a lack of inventory of rental units.

All these elements impede the attraction of new residents, which is necessary for the economic, social and community vitality of the Town. In addition, Lac Brome is experiencing an accelerated aging of its population. Households of 65 years of age and over represent 45% of the total households, which is high in comparison to the rest of the MRC (36%).

The preparation of a strategy on housing appears to us to be the best method to respond to these issues in an adequate and thoughtful manner. This strategy is being developed and will be finalized in cooperation with the different housing stakeholders in our town.

#### DID YOU KNOW?

There exists an indicator\* to calculate availability of housing. Since 1986, the Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation (CMHC) and the Canadian provinces have agreed to use the threshold of 30% of gross revenues to measure availability in order to define the needs related to housing. A housing unit is considered accessible if its occupants contribute 30% or less of the total household revenue to housing.

The average price of a single-family home in Lac Brome\*\* was \$520,000 in 2022. A family that would want to purchase a house at this price while not spending more than 30% of the household income would have to earn approximately \$142,000 per year. The average revenue of a household in Quebec was \$52,000 in 2020\*\*\*.

# A \$2.96 MILLION SURPLUS FOR THE YEAR 2022

As dictated by tradition, at this time of the year in the municipal field, it is time for us to share the financial results for the year 2022. Here are the highlights of the 2022 year for Town of Brome Lake:

#### THE MAIN ACCOMPLISHMENTS



#### • STREETS, ROADS AND TECHNICAL SERVICES

- Reconstruction of roads (for a little over \$1.6M)
  - · Johnston

- Sewer and water lines in the mobile home park in West Brome (a \$3M project)
- Mill Pond dam

#### • Recreation and culture

- Public art installation of two sculptures
- Integration of an accredited daycare in our municipal buildings
- Operating revenues of \$20.02M (+\$2.73M)
- Expenses of \$15.05M (+\$52,000)
- Surplus of revenues over expenses of \$2.68M
- The surplus is mainly attributable to the collection of \$1.86M more in mutation fees (also called the welcome tax) than projected in the budget.

This is the list of projects to which Council has decided to attribute a portion of the surplus in the amount of \$2.96M:

In closing, because of this, as of December 31, 2022, the Town has a surplus of \$1.74M available for unexpected contingencies, while the surplus designated for various projects is as follows:

# Are You Familiar With Our Boat Washing Station?

The preservation of Brome Lake is one of the most important environmental issues in the eyes of our elected officials. With this in mind, the Town took charge of the management of the boat washing station last year. For the second year running, Maurice Marine will be operating it on behalf of the Town.

This station, which was inaugurated and then operated by the Conservation Lac-Brome organization in 2020 and 2021, was put in place to prevent the proliferation of undesirable aquatic species in our lake

As the high season for nautical activities approaches, the Town has initiated a campaign to better publicize the existence of the station, including signage in various places of the town as well as through publications in local media.

"We all want to keep our lake in good health," says Louise Morin, the Councillor responsible for environmental issues. "The boat washing station is a simple, free measure to prevent the introduction of invasive species. We are very lucky that we do not have Zebra mussels in our lake and we wish to keep it that way. We therefore hope that every watercraft, motorized or not, will pass through the boat washing station before launching into our lake."

We should point out that watercraft that are situated on the lake permanently are not required to be washed at the station.

MAIN SOURCES OF INVASIVE AQUATIC SPECIES PRESENT OR LIKELY TO BE PRESENT (source: Government of Canada)

• **Zebra Mussels** (not found in Brome Lake)

Originally from Eurasia, the Zebra Mussel (and the Quagga Mussel) live and reproduce primarily in freshwater. These species have the capacity to lay a million eggs per year, monopolizing the food sources to the detriment of indigenous species. The Zebra Mussel can constitute



colonies of a density exceeding 700,000 individuals per square meter on surfaces like boats, docks, rocks, etc. It has been found in certain aquatic areas in the Townships since 2017.

#### • FEATHERED WATERMILFOIL (found in Brome Lake)

Originally from Eurasia and Africa, this species reproduces rapidly, invading and replacing the local indigenous plant life. Because of its density and large numbers, it is harmful to swimming, watercraft navigation and fishing and renders beaches less attractive.

#### STATISTICS ON OUR BOAT WASHING STATION

881 watercrafts were washed in 2022, of which over 700 did not come from Brome Lake.

# **OUR ACTION PLAN** FOR A NOURISHING **COMMUNITY IS UNDERWAY**



ollowing several steps taken with the MRC of Brome-Missisquoi, the Town of Brome Lake has unveiled its action plan as part of its nourishing community project.

Projected over a three-year period, the proposed action plan is centered on six aspects: agricultural production, transformation and distribution of food, food security, local purchasing, management of residual materials and governance and mobilization of the community.

Among the proposed actions, let us point out the planting of edible plants and fruit trees on our territory as of this summer, the priority purchasing of local foods for municipal events and the organization of educational trips to food producers of the region for students in our two primary schools.

The Town has stepped up, with a number of other municipalities, joining this project whose objective is to place food security at the heart of our community and to make our food production system more sustainable.


