

Dear fellow citizens,

In these unsettled times, I would like to take a few minutes to speak about civility. The municipal level of government is the one that has the greatest proximity to the population. And the addition of sidewalks, mainly on Victoria Street and on Hwy 104 (up to the SAQ) will make a significant improvement to active mobility on our territory.

We are also undertaking the first complete year of our Strategic Plan, adopted in September 2024. If you have not already done so, you can consult it **by clicking here**.

I also invite you to discover the list of other planned projects on the pages of this issue. In closing, let's look forward to celebrating Spring when our beautiful town will find its colours again!


New Sidewalks!

The network of sidewalks in the Town will be improved over the coming months! This project is linked to the implementation of our active mobility objective 2021-2031 for the Town of Brome Lake, as established by l'Institut des territoires in September 2021. This project is estimated to cost \$1.5 million, for which the Town will obtain a subsidy of \$890,000.


Planned for the summer of 2025, the addition of sidewalks on Knowlton Road and Victoria Street will enhance and make active transport safer in the municipality. The project also provides for a change in the road markings to create unidirectional cycling paths on all of Victoria Street.

More specifically, the objective of the project is to create a link between the end of the existing sidewalk on Victoria Street at the intersection of Centre Street which stops, at the present time, in front of the SAQ. The project will cover a total distance of 1.6 km. This new stretch of sidewalk will permit safer access to Lions Park, the Community Centre, the medical clinic and La passerelle des mousses daycare, as well as to the various businesses on Knowlton Road. Of note: because these projects are being constructed in proximity to Saint Edward's primary school and the Knowlton Academy, they will also greatly improve safety in the school corridor.

The new cycling paths on Victoria will have the following configuration:



The main objective of these changes is the development of pedestrian and cycling networks that are efficient, safe and complementary to other methods of transport in an urban setting. This action will contribute to encouraging safe travel for all users, in all seasons.



The existing sidewalks are shown in green and the future additions, which will complete the network, are shown in red!

To simplify the management of your municipal taxes, we invite you to sign up for the <u>online</u> <u>tax account service</u>. This service allows you to consult and follow the development of your file. It is simple, fast, and secure, and can be done in the comfort of your home.

Signing up for this service is quick and easy. All you need to do is go to our website and follow the steps. You must have your tax bill number in hand to sign up.

A gesture for the environment

By choosing to receive your tax documents online, you will also contribute to preserving the environment. This simple step will allow us to reduce the use of paper and decrease costs related to the printing and mailing of bills.

Whether you are a full-time or part-time resident of Brome Lake or even travelling to a foreign country, you may consult your file online at any time. Access your information easily on your phone, tablet or computer, without constraints of time or place, according to your own schedule. And, thanks to the automatic payment reminders, you will never miss a payment.

The paper version is still available

If you prefer receiving your tax documents in paper form, this remains possible because distribution by mail will be maintained.

For those who choose to sign up for the online service, you have the option of eliminating the paper version completely.

We encourage you to take advantage of the online service to manage your taxes in a safer and more practical manner.

NEW PICKLEBALL COURTS IN BROME LAKE



The three new pickleball courts will be built near those already set up in the Lions Park. Pickleball is a sport that is gaining popularity, including in Brome Lake. To respond to the increase in demand, the Town plans significant investments in 2025 to increase its offer of service. Over the next few months, three new courts will be built near the existing installations in Lions Park.

While these courts are dedicated entirely to pickleball, other multi-sport surfaces such as those at Prouty Park in Bondville and the Ovide-Dagenais Community Center in Foster can also be used for this sport.

To ensure the quality of these new facilities, a number of meetings took place between the representatives of the Recreation Services Department of the Town and the executive of the pickleball club. The objective was to define specific needs and prioritize the infrastructure work for the coming years.

It was agreed that, to optimize the \$250,000 municipal investment, part of the work would be done by the Public Works department. This will include excavation, the clearing of the site and the building of the foundations of the new courts, all of which will be based on the recommendations of a specialist. This specialist, who will be chosen in the coming weeks, will also supervise the installation of the playing surfaces.

THE BROME LAKE PICKLEBALL CLUB:

The Brome Lake Pickleball Club had 391 members in 2024 and the Club de la Bonne Humeur (FADOQ) had approximately 150 players. This indicates that almost 10% of the Town's population participates in this sport.

For its part, the Fédération québécoise de pickleball (FQP) represents more than 12,000 members, spread over 60 clubs or associations.

We should mention that, in addition to the three new courts, the investment provides for fencing and lighting which will permit evening play. At the present time, it is difficult to establish a precise timetable but the Town hopes to have the courts built by mid-June. A number of factors might affect this timetable, in particular the date of the start of the work.

A new play module for children at Lions Park

The Town intends to invest \$100,000 to add a new play module for children. This module, intended for the 5- to 12-year-old range, can accommodate from 20 to 25 children at the same time. The final choice of supplier and details of the project will be announced shortly.

Projects for 2026

The Town's Recreation Department is planning further investments for the repair, maintenance and the addition of lighting on the 11 existing pickleball courts in Brome Lake. In 2026, park furnishings will be installed to accommodate the many participants and visitors in order to make the space more accessible and convivial.

A LOOK AT 2025 PROJECTS!

Before looking at the list of projects planned for 2025, let's open a parenthesis to mention that one of the major projects planned in the budget, the rebuilding of Fulford Road, has been carried over to next year because of a lack of subsidies. This is a project, estimated at \$9 million, for which the Town hoped to receive a 50% subsidy. We learned just before the holidays that our requests to the Programme d'aide à la voirie locale (PAVL) for the replacement of culverts, gravel road repairs and this major project had been refused.

Notwithstanding this, and because the Town wishes to continue maintaining its road network, we will dig into our savings to the tune of \$1.8 million for this project. Of this amount, \$800,000 will be spent on the re-gravelling of Byers, Barnes, McCurdy and Turner Roads. A plan will be worked out to reconstruct Fulford, a major access route that is in poor condition, in 2026.

An amount of \$1 million will be used to resurface some asphalt roads that are deemed to be a priority. These operations will involve more than simply patching potholes; areas of a few 100 meters will be repaved. This work could have a lifetime of 10 years.



The farmers' market site on Maple Street will undergo a second phase of development over the coming months.

The following are a few other projects:

Construction of pickleball courts

There will be three, and they will be built in Lions Park near the existing courts. A budget of \$250,000 has been established for this project. You can read our text on page 4 to learn more.

Completion of the Carke Terrace washroom facilities

The building in this public space on Bondville Street will be accessible this Spring.

Creation of a citizen consultation module

An interactive module to receive citizens' opinions and promote their involvement in municipal projects.

Installation of an autonomous boat washing station

An autonomous washing station to protect our waterways from invasive species.

Installation of a new play module

Purchase of a play module for children and families who visit Lions Park.

Second phase of improvements to the public market

Addition of various elements to improve visitors' experience.

A New Coordinator in Leisure and Community Life



Citizens of Brome Lake who have been going to the Centre Lac-Brome over the last few weeks may have crossed paths with a new member of the team. He is Thomas-Daniel Bergeron, the new Coordinator in Leisure and Recreational Infrastructures, who took up responsibilities at the beginning of December.

Thomas-Daniel Bergeron will have, as an objective, supervising the programming of seasonal activities while overseeing the preparation of the Salamander Summer day camp. In collaboration with his colleague Jade Barrette, he will also be responsible for the planning of the next soccer season. In short, a very full agenda!

Originally from Sorel-Tracy, Thomas-Daniel Bergeron has always been passionate about the organization of sports and recreational activities. In fact, this is not his first experience in the municipal world. During his studies, he worked for the City of Sorel-Tracy as a skating rinks and sports fields attendant.

After his college studies, Thomas-Daniel began a Bachelor of Education in Physical Education in Chicoutimi. He decided, however, to complete his university training at the Université de Trois-Rivières in Leisure, Culture and Tourism, a program that had been recommended to him by a colleague who saw his special aptitudes in this area.

Before joining the Town of Brome Lake, Thomas-Daniel worked as Coordinator and Interim Director of the La Ruche Sports Centre in Magog, an experience that prepared him to take on new challenges.

The summer of the Salamanders

Having arrived just a few weeks before the start of Spring, the new coordinator is already working on the plans for the coming summer.

The Salamander Summer day camp, which welcomes some 130 children per week, will obviously be back in 2025. While he does not anticipate any major changes because the camp already has an excellent structure, Thomas-Daniel hopes to diversify the activities planned for Douglass Beach to allow more groups to take advantage of the installations.

Soccer

The development of soccer is a major part of Thomas-Daniel Bergeron's priorities. In cooperation with Jade Barrette, the coordinator responsible for soccer in Brome Lake, he intends to submit the candidacy of Brome Lake to be recognized as a Quality Soccer Providers as part of the Club Licensing Program, an initiative of Soccer Canada supported by Soccer Québec. This recognition would open up the possibility of teams from Brome Lake to play in competitive leagues and benefit from certified referees.

In the longer term, Thomas-Daniel hopes to see the return of a local soccer association with the support of volunteers who would take charge of the activities on the territory, in cooperation with the Town.

Until then, the new Coordinator of Leisure and Recreational Infrastructures will stay busy. He is, at the present time, working on the organization of the Polar

Beach Party which will take place this year on March 8th at Douglass Beach. A number of family-oriented activities are already planned, such as inflatable games, floats with winter themes, music, kites and a snow skating activity.

RECYCLING COLLECTION SIMPLIFIED: A NEW START!

Aare over in Quebec! Rules are now the same everywhere and the collection of recycling is simpler and more efficient. Items that used to be thrown in the garbage, like chip bags, small yogurt containers, plastic wrap and cereal bags, can now be put in the recycling bin.

Containers, packaging, printed paper. That's it.

Good news!

- Polystyrene food trays can now be recycled!
- No need to check the numbers on plastic!

Exceptions: to be placed in the garbage or sent to the Eco Centre

- × To the Eco Centre:
- Aerosols (that contain metals under pressure)
- Polystyrene packaging that comes apart in beads
- **×** To the garbage:
 - Biodegradable or degradable plastic

The refundable deposit is changing too!

As of March 1st, all plastic bottles from 100 ml to 2 litres can be recycled (water, juice, alcohol). No need to look for the "refundable" designation! The amount paid is 10 ϕ , except for glass bottles of 500 ml or more (25 ϕ). You can find the complete <u>list of recyclable containers</u> and where to return them here.

s of January 1, 2025, recycling headaches

What changes in your bin

All containers, packaging, and printed material can be placed in bulk in your blue recycling bin.

- A container: anything that has a cap or a lid (i.e., juice bottles,
 yogurt containers, etc.)
- Packaging: anything that protects or supports a product (i.e., plastic wrap, chip bags, hangers, etc.)
- Initial Printed material: any paper with text or pictures, less than 5 years old (i.e., newspapers, magazines, travel guides, schoolbooks, etc.)

Some rules to follow

- Material must be put into the bin in bulk without being bagged in plastic
- Containers and packaging made up of different materials must be separated (i.e., remove the metal lids from glass jars, remove the cereal bag from the box). Exception: small bottle caps of less than 5 cm must stay on the container
- Boxes must be folded.

Where do we put glass?

Glass can continue to be placed in the blue bin, but we strongly encourage you to deposit it in the container situated at the Knowlton IGA. Otherwise, a lot of glass might be sent to the landfill.



PREPARE YOUR SPRING PROJECTS WITH THE RIGHT INFORMATION!

With the arrival of Spring, you may be planning improvements on your property. Before starting the work, it is important to be aware of the rules in effect in your sector and, depending on the type of project, a permit may be required.

The Town of Brome Lake has established certain standards in terms of zoning, architecture, and the quality of construction material to preserve harmony and cohesiveness in the development of both its rural and urban sectors.

It is advisable to submit your request for a permit at least 60 days before the start of work to comply with the required deadlines.

To do this, go directly to the Town of Brome Lake website.

Important Note: The handling of a request for a permit can take between 2 and 4 weeks. If a minor exception is necessary, the delay can extend to 8 to 12 weeks.




