OUR PUMP TRACK STARTS WITH A BANG!

t is wonderful to note that our new pump track, inaugurated in October, is already very popular among the youth of Brome Lake!

For those who are not familiar with the concept, a pump track is a paved track with a number of bumps and turns that allow the users to gain speed without putting a foot on the ground. The more skillful practitioners can also perform athletic maneuvers. Believe us, if you try it, you'll love it!

TOWN PLANNING 101

While the Town of Brome Lake plans to launch the revision of its Town Plan in 2024, let us review certain terms frequently used in town planning.

The Town Plan

The Town Plan, as defined by *le Ministère des Affaires municipales et de l'Habitation (MAMH)*, is an essential document which establishes the objectives for the physical organization of the municipality. It offers a global vision of the territorial set-up and represents the most important document in terms of municipal planning.

Densification

According to the organization *Vivre en ville*, "Densification refers to a method of growth of a city which consists of increasing the number of residents or activities (businesses, offices, daycares, etc.) in areas that are already urbanized rather than encouraging an extension of the city into areas that are not built-up[...] It has the potential of consolidating established neighborhoods by promoting the vitality of services and the profitability of existing facilities (businesses, schools, public transport, water services, etc.)"

Urban Perimeter

All of the projects mentioned above are built within the urban perimeter. What does this term mean exactly? The urban perimeter designates the defined limit around an urban zone, encompassing the structures and the activities associated with an urban development. This includes residences, infrastructures, and public spaces.

Often defined by municipal regulations, the urban perimeter seeks to plan and control urban development expansion for a more efficient management of resources and the preservation of the environment.

It promotes the coherent development of inhabited zones by encouraging their sustainability and the quality of life. The management of the urban perimeter is crucial to balance urban expansion and preserve natural resources.

Land Use

The concept of land use refers to the activities authorized in a zone, in accordance with the Town Plan. The uses are defined within the territory, taking into consideration their complementarity and compatibility with the environment.

For example (see the picture below), zone URA-27, in the area of Bourgade and Jean-Lapierre Streets on the map, is a low-density residential zone. The authorized use is limited to single family dwellings, meaning a house that does not share a wall with any other residence.

Zoning Bylaw

According to the MAMH, a zoning bylaw allows for the division of the territory into zones in order to control land use and building construction as well as the siting, form, and appearances of the construction (for example, their height).

Understanding A Zoning Code

Let's take the URA-27 zone as an example, illustrated on the map:

- URA refers to a low-density urban zone
- 27 indicates the number sequence assigned to this zone. This is the 27th URA zone (out of 27).



n 2023, the Town of Brome Lake resolutely decided to take a leadership position in terms of the environment on its territory by announcing the hiring of an environmental advisor and by putting a number of concrete actions in place. Here's a list of a few of these.

Winter:



Our Action Plan for a Healthy Lake 2022-2026.

- a) Awarded of a grant to Conservation Lac Brome to follow up on water quality, hire a part-time biologist and implement certain steps to improve the health of the lake.
- b) Started monthly meetings with the consultative committee on the environment for the year 2023, thereby consolidating community involvement.
- c) Launched the Action Plan for a Healthy Lake 2022-2026, the result of collaboration between the Town of Brome Lake, Conservation Lac Brome and l'Organisme de bassin versant (OBV) de la Yamaska.

Spring:

- **d)** Strengthening of the regulations concerning shorelines around the lake with the delivery of a letter to the owners who did not respect the rules, requesting that they conform.
- **e)** Public presentation on the *Action Plan for a Healthy Lake* by councillor Louise Morin during the annual general meeting of Conservation Lac Brome.
- f) Opening of the cleaning station for watercraft, that remained open until Labour Day.
- **g)** The Town joined the OBV Yamaska in a program encouraging the creation of rain gardens with technical aid and a municipal grant of up to \$1000.

- h) Beginning of the nautical patrol five days a week to sensitize pleasure craft users by pointing out the importance of respecting navigational limits to prevent shoreline erosion and sedimentation.
- The installation of two charging stations in the parking lot of Theatre Lac-Brome.

Summer:

- j) Official hiring of Anaïs Renaud, our new advisor on environmental matters.
- k) Publication of Identification and control sheets for the main terrestrial invasive alien species.
- 1) The testing of septic installations was carried out in certain risk areas.
- m) A vegetized shoreline was built at Carke Park.
- n) A guide outlining good shoreline practices was sent to new residents of Brome Lake.
- **0)** Infraction notices were issued to non-conforming shoreline residents; a first in Brome Lake.
- p) Evaluation of our performance in terms of the management of rainwater by following a self-diagnosis from the Regroupement des organismes de bassins versants du Québec (ROBVQ).

Autumn:

- **q)** Mayor Richard Burcombe invited the municipalities of the Brome Lake watershed to participate in the follow-up committee for a healthy lake, promoting an integrated management of the lake water.
- r) Collection of Halloween candy wrappers for recycling.
- S) Implementation of a program for the vegetation of the lakeshore for certain targeted owners.

This report for the year 2023 is an excellent exercise for the Town of Brome Lake. It demonstrates its continued undertaking in favor of the environment by taking tangible action to ensure the sustainability of the community and the preservation of the lake. ■






